Dear Sirs:

Your application for a Department of the Army permit received on March 3, 2006, has been assigned number SAJ-2006-1652-MEP. A review of the information and drawings provided shows the proposed work is to construct a 13 acre, 152 unit, residential multi-family condominium subdivision known as "The Residences at Grande Bay", and construct an associated 18 acre mixed-use residential and commercial development, known as "The Shoppes at Grande Bay". The project, as proposed, will impact 0.11 acres of a 1.14 acre fresh water wetland that is dominated by exotic vegetation, and will impact 0.39 acres of a ditch that connects the freshwater wetland to little Sarasota Bay. mitigate for impacts to wetlands of the United States, 1.03 acres of the on-site wetland will be enhanced, and 0.14 acres of forested wetlands will be created. The project is located just west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 41 and Beneva Road, in Section 28, Township 37 South, Range 18 East, Sarasota County, Florida.

The Supreme Court handed down a decision on June 19, 2006, in the Rapanos and Carabell cases. That decision addresses the scope of Clean Water Act jurisdiction over certain waters of the United States, including wetlands. We anticipate that the decision will lead the Corps and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to make some changes in our scope of jurisdiction.

Your project includes activities, which are regulated under the current interpretation of Federal jurisdiction under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Your project includes special conditions that require compensatory mitigation for impacts to areas of Federal jurisdiction. Any changes to our scope of jurisdiction could require reassessment of these mitigation requirements and/or other project modification. You will have an opportunity to re-address the terms or conditions of this authorization following issuance of the anticipated EPA/Army substantive Rapanos/Carabell guidance, if such guidance affects Federal jurisdiction on your permit site.

Your project, as depicted on the enclosed drawings, is authorized by Nationwide Permit (NWP) Number 39. In addition, project specific conditions have been enclosed. This verification is valid until March 18, 2006. This verification is valid until the NWP is modified, reissued, or revoked prior to March 18, 2007. It is incumbent upon you to remain informed of changes to the NWPs. We will issue a public notice when the NWPs are issued. Furthermore, if you commence or are under contract to commence this activity before the date that the relevant nationwide permit is modified or revoked, you will have 12 months from the date of the modification or revocation of the NWP to complete the activity under the present terms and conditions of this nationwide permit. These files contain the description of the Nationwide Permit authorization, the Nationwide Permit general conditions, and the regional conditions, which apply specifically to this verification for NWP 39. Additionally, enclosed is a list of the six General Conditions, which apply to all Department of the Army authorizations. You must comply with all of the special and general conditions and any project specific condition of this authorization or you may be subject to enforcement action. In the event you have not completed construction of your project within the specified time limit, a separate application or reverification may be required.

The following special conditions are included with this verification:

- 1. Within 60 days of completion of the work authorized, the attached "Self-Certification Statement of Compliance" must be completed and submitted to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Mail the completed form to the Regulatory Division, Enforcement Section, Post Office Box 4970, Jacksonville, Florida 32232-0019.
- 2. The permittee shall comply with the attached Biological Opinion for the bald eagle, dated September 14, 2006, and the terms, conditions, and recommendations specified therein.
- 3. The permittee shall follow the attached "Standard Protection Measures for the Eastern Indigo Snake".
- 4. To mitigate for wetland impacts, the permittee shall enhance 1.03 acres of on-site wetlands, and create 0.14 acres of forested wetlands. The mitigation shall be constructed, monitored, and maintained in compliance with the attached permit drawings and SWFWMD ERP No. 44030481.000 (attached).

This letter of authorization does not obviate the necessity to obtain any other Federal, State, or local permits, which may be required. In Florida, projects qualifying for this NWP must be authorized under Part IV of Chapter 373 by the Department of Environmental Protection, a water management district under §. 373.069, F.S., or a local government with delegated authority under §. 373.441, F.S., and receive Water Quality Certification (WQC) and Coastal Zone Consistency Concurrence (CZCC) (or a waiver), as well as any authorizations required by the State for the use of sovereignty submerged lands. You should check Statepermitting requirements with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or the appropriate water management district.

This letter does not give absolute Federal authority to perform the work as specified on your application. The proposed work may be subject to local building restrictions mandated by the National Flood Insurance Program. You should contact your local office that issues building permits to determine if your

site is located in a flood-prone area, and if you must comply with the local building requirements mandated by the National Flood Insurance Program.

GENERAL CONDITIONS 33 CFR PART 320-330 PUBLISHED FEDERAL REGISTER DATED 13 NOVEMBER 1986

- 1. The time limit for completing the work authorized ends on March 18, 2007. If you find that you need more time to complete the authorized activity, submit your request for a time extension to this office for consideration at least one month before the above date is reached.
- 2. You must maintain the activity authorized by this permit in good condition and in conformance with the terms and conditions of this permit. You are not relieved of this requirement if you abandon the permitted activity, although you may make a good faith transfer to a third party in compliance with General Condition 4 below. Should you wish to cease to maintain the authorized activity or should you desire to abandon it without a good faith transfer, you must obtain a modification of this permit from this office, which may require restoration of the
- 3. If you discover any previously unknown historic or archeological remains while accomplishing the activity authorized by this permit, you must immediately notify this office of what you have found. We will initiate the Federal and state coordination required to determine if the remains warrant a recovery effort of if the site is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.










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












Grande Bay Mitigation Areas Plan View & Cross Section
